From 1 April 2013 until 31 March 2023

NHS Resolution received 1,137 CNST claims relating to dermatology.

The sum of damages paid was £34,035,320.60


Claims received Between 2013-2023



Claims were settled with damages paid




Claims were settled with no damages paid




### CNST dermatology claims by age






## CNST successful dermatology claims





# CNST successful dermatology claims by injury by volume and value






### CNST dermatology claims by type



Of the claims received, 690 were related to lesion dermatology.

Most commonly malignant or metastatic melanoma followed by squamous cell and basal cell carcinoma.



## Illustrative case study

As you read about this incident, please ask yourself;

- Could this happen in my organisation?

### 1. Situation

Female patient, was seen by locum GP diagnosed with a compound mole and referred for excision in early 2018. Was not aware of suspension of minor surgery list.

#### 3. Assessment

Dermatology diagnosed pernicious malignant melanoma and cancer treatment was commenced.
Sadly, the cancer metastasized, and the patient passed away in 2020.

### 2. Background

The patient remained on an unmonitored list. Following noted changes in the mole, the patient returned to the practice in mid 2019. The GP made an urgent referral to dermatology.

#### 4. Outcome

The case highlights the importance of comprehensive induction for temporary staff, communication of current process, oversight of redundant process and accountability for follow up.
