



Claims related to dermatology





From 1 April 2013 until 31 March 2023 NHS Resolution received 226 claims relating to dermatology across the general practice indemnity schemes.

39 were closed with damages paid. The sum of total damages is £1,849,444.

Claims received Between 2013-2023







GP dermatology claims by claimant gender wis

ELSGP CNSGP gender split for closed/settled dermatology claims




ELSGP CNSGP age and gender split for closed/settled dermatology claims

ELSGP CNSGP closed settled dermatology claims by cause, total claim and total number of claims




Dermatology claims by type



Of the claims received, **85%** were related to lesion dermatology.

Most commonly malignant or metastatic melanoma followed by basal cell and squamous cell carcinoma.

Illustrative case study

As you read about this incident, please ask yourself;

1. Situation

30 year old male, had been seen regularly by GP over 18 months with changing lesion on his torso.
Incident form submitted by dermatology.

3. Assessment

Dermatology were critical that the patient had not been referred earlier in adherence with local and national guidelines. Further biopsy was required as well as lymph node removal.

2. Background

The patient reported a raised mole and was reassured that it was benign. Over several visits, the mole continued to change until the GP completed a biopsy. The histology report identified that the mole was malignant and a 2 Week Wait (2WW) referral was sent to Dermatology.

4. Outcome

The patient pursued a claim for the delayed diagnosis of cancer and more extensive treatment required as a result of the 18month delay. Claim settled for circa £40,000.
